Quote:

Explanation of the choice:

The beehive, the bee colony as a metaphor for the human community, for society. All the bees are tirelessly at work, caring for the future: flying back and forth to gather honey and pollen while others tend the nest and the larvae. So many elements from the weekly letter can be recognized here: "Staying connected": with the colony, with nature — without pollinators, there is no life; "Cooperation": the colony can only come into being and survive through collaboration; "Taking responsibility": every bee will sacrifice its life if the survival of the colony is at stake; "Feeding the hungry": honey is not only highly nutritious but also healing in medicine; "Caring for the future": the bees' care and dedication give the larvae the best possible chance to grow up healthy; "For a world of tomorrow": most bees will not live to see the next spring, yet they build the colony so that a new generation can swarm when spring returns.

I am curious to hear what other symbolism you might see in it.
