Then they look for their country, and then the continent where they live. Living life to the fullest, so that I don't feel fear flowing through my veins, but space and a loving presence. Or as Huub Oosterhuis once said: 'So that we do not suffocate in ourselves but open up'.

And because I live from out of our Apostolic foundation statement, because I choose *to be simply Apostolic, to go beyond the ordinary and to bring the story of love together*² it makes an appeal to me, and I know that I have to get out of my comfort zone. That in 2025 we can, want and must consciously breathe new life into our ideal.

That we have to move mountains with love.

To this end, I want to invoke the highest in myself and in you today. In this way I give direction to history. Probably not equal to that of all humanity, but certainly to my own. And also to the people around me and to those I am close to in thought, which goes far beyond my own circle. And if the ripples in the water radiate, then it will be there when we are there.
